From the Treasurer's Office

The primary issue affecting my office during the pandemic has been the level of service provided by the U.S. Postal Service. Mail has been delayed both sending and receiving. Following are ways to minimize issues.

Utility Payments

- Online payments can be made on our website, augustatownship.org. The contracted provider for this service charges a fee, either \$3.00 or a tiered amount based on the amount charged
- Automated payments can be made for no cost by completing and submitting the Application available on our website under Documents; Forms & Applications. Once you are enrolled, the amount due will be deducted from your bank account on the date due. Contact Joanne at deputytreasurer@augustatownship.org if you have questions on this option.

Treasurer Drop Box

Check payments can be dropped off in a secure drop box into the wall at the Township Hall 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Your check is your receipt but if you require a printed receipt note that on your remittance and we will send one to you via U.S. mail or email (if provided).

BS&A Online is a collection of municipal services providing instant and convenient access to various kinds of important information held at your local government. This site is updated immediately when Utility or Tax bills are issued. This is also the same site where online Tax and Utility payments can be made.

We are hopeful that one or more of these options will help. As a reminder, the treasurer's office will only accept cash payments (exact change) inside the hall. We request that you pay using the drop box (preferred), by mail (allow lots of time), or online.



Washtenaw County Broadband Task Force

Established by the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners





Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners has approved a plan that will provide broadband access to all residents of Washtenaw County. Internet access to your residence will be funded by either the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF), Connecting Michigan Communities (CMIC) or by Washtenaw County American Rescue Plan Act funds (ARPA). Augusta Township Clerks office serves on this Task Force.

Election Polling Places Update

The Augusta Township Board of Trustees approved my request to establish new polling places. I had concerns with keeping the existing polling locations. The Lincoln Senior Center, used for Precinct 1 and 2, may not be accessible as a polling location for future elections due to school safety mandates. Precinct 3, the modular at the township hall, was unable to accommodate the November 2020 election to my standards.

Consequently, all Augusta Township polling locations have been relocated. All 3 Precincts will use The Family Center at St. Joseph Catholic Church, 9425 Whittaker Road, Ypsilanti.

A flier with details is enclosed. I will notify all registered electors again before the next election.
