**Paid-on-Call Firefighter (Augusta Township, MI)**  
 Augusta Township Fire Department is accepting applications for the position of firefighter. Firefighters have the responsibility of protecting life and property by performing fire suppression, rescue, emergency medical services (EMS), hazardous materials incident mitigation, fire prevention, and public education. Other responsibilities include maintaining fire equipment, apparatus, fire station facilities, and performing other duties as required. Firefighters work as a team to ensure the overall goals and objectives of the Fire Department are met.

No prior fire/EMS training or experience is necessary but is preferred.

**Compensation**

\* Augusta Township Fire Department is a Paid-on-Call fire department. This means you are only compensated when performing duties on an emergency call or attending department-approved training.

\* Hourly rates are based on level of training:

- \* Probationary firefighter without EMS or Fire I & II: \$12.48/hour
- \* Probationary firefighter with Fire I & II without EMS: \$17.98/hour
- \* Probationary firefighter with EMS without Fire I & II: \$17.98/hour
- \* Probationary firefighter with Fire I & II and EMS: \$22.80/hour

**Essential Duties and Responsibilities**

- \* Performs firefighting activities including driving fire apparatus, operating pumps and related equipment, laying hose, and performing fire suppression, containment, ventilation, salvage and overhaul, and extinguishment tasks.
- \* Performs emergency medical services and rescue activities including administering first aid and CPR, operating EMS equipment such as defibrillators and portable suction units, performing extrication, and providing other assistance as required.
- \* Assists in public safety programs related to fire prevention, education, and outreach.
- \* Responds to and assists in all emergency situations when available, including but not limited to: rescuing persons and property; evacuating, securing, and coordinating emergency scenes; operating equipment in an efficient and safe manner; and assisting other emergency agencies in the performance of their duties.
- \* On occasion, may be assigned or responsible for administrative responsibilities, including completion of incident response reports.
- \* May take a limited leadership role during calls for service, providing direction to less experienced firefighting personnel, as assigned by a supervisor or in the absence of a supervisor.
- \* Must be able to accept authority and work as a team member under stress caused by emergencies, danger, or criticism, and must be able to work quickly while concentrating very hard.

\* Maintains and expands knowledge and skills in the areas of fire suppression, rescue, EMS, hazardous materials mitigation, and fire prevention by attending regular and assigned department training sessions scheduled every Thursday night at 7:00 PM.

\* Serves as a representative of the township, performing duties in a courteous and professional manner that conveys a positive image of the township and fosters cooperation and support.

**Minimum Qualifications**

- \* Must have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- \* Must be 18 years of age on appointment date.
- \* Must successfully pass an initial physical ability/condition test and physical examination.
- \* Must possess a valid Michigan driver's license.
- \* Must live within 3 miles of the Augusta Township line.
- \* Must have the ability to regularly respond to emergency calls.
- \* Successful completion of Michigan Firefighter I & II courses within 2 years of hire date.
- \* Successful completion of a medical first responder licensure or higher within 2 years of hire date.
