- Three PA116 applications for farmland in Augusta Charter Township have been approved by the State of Michigan. PA116 refers to Michigan Public Act 116, the Farmland and Open Space Preservation Act. It is a voluntary program that allows landowners to enter into an agreement to keep their land in agricultural use for 10 - 90 years. This is great way to support the farmers.

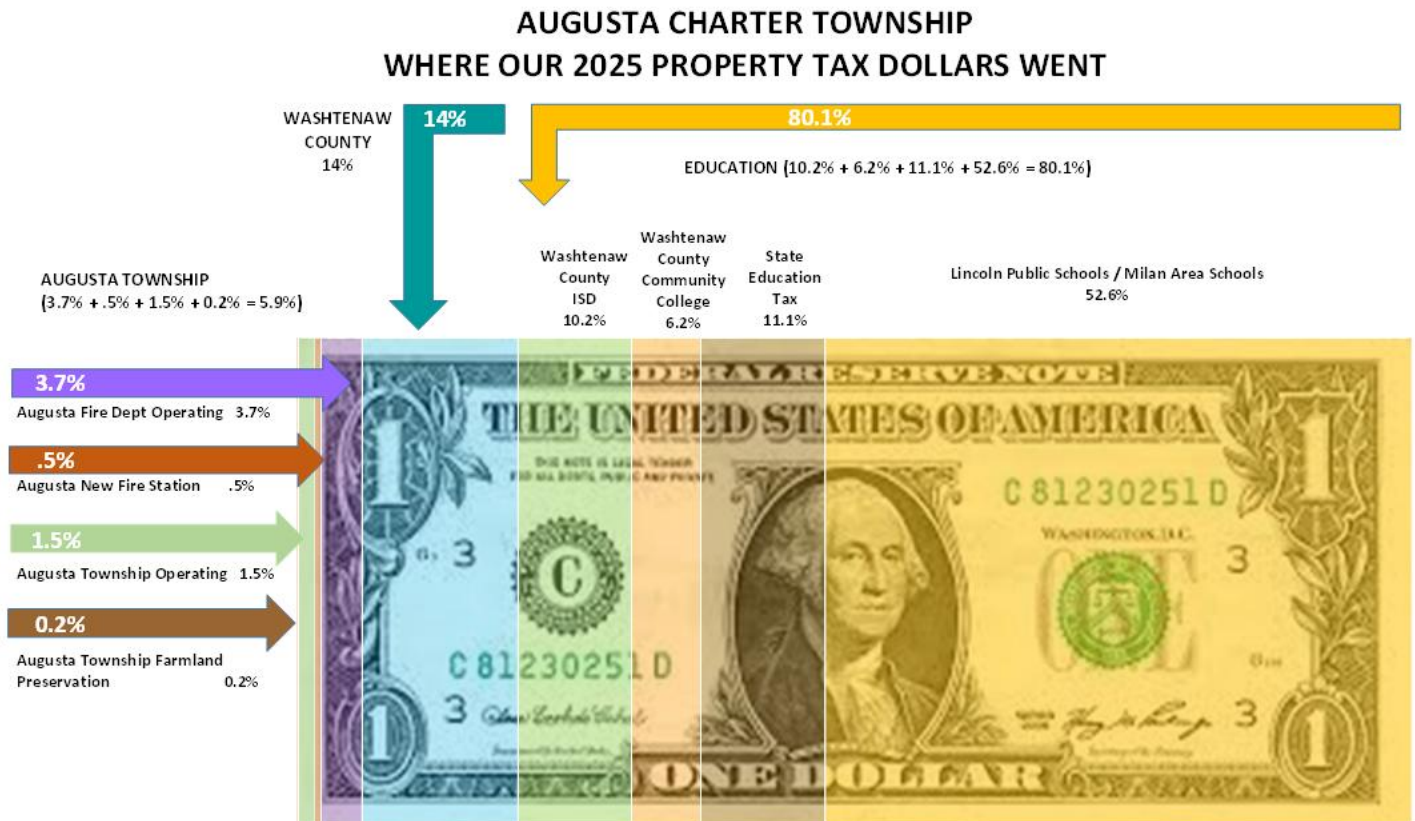

The Treasurer's office updated Augusta Charter Township "Where our 2025 Property Tax Dollars Went" that is posted on the township website. You can compare the milage increases since we first reported in 2021. The Education taxes increased 1.0%, Washtenaw County .5%, and Augusta township decreased 1.5%, due to the new fire station milage completion.
